


SYMPOSIUMS AND WORKSHOPS

シンポジウム・ワークショップ

A special symposium was held on November 25, 2020, at the NBC Video Hall, City of Nagasaki, and online as well. The purpose of this event called “Peace and Disarmament Education in an Emerging Era of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons” was to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Nagasaki Atomic Bombing. It was organized by Nagasaki University’s Research Center for Nuclear Weapons Abolition (RECNA) in cooperation with ICU’s Peace Research Institute. With the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) entering into force in January next year, researchers and practitioners from Japan and overseas gathered to discuss what kind of education is required this modern day and age. At the symposium, a special lecture on "The Origin of War and the Future of Humanity" was first given by Professor Juichi Yamagiwa, the former 26th President of Kyoto University.

In the next segment of the symposium, four speakers reported and discussed on the theme of "Peace and Disarmament Education in a New Era" which was moderated by ICU’s Professor Mikiko Nishimura (PRI member). ICU’s Professor Toshiaki Sasao (PRI Director), Mr. Valere Mantels Head, United Nations Office of Disarmament Affairs (UNODA) Vienna Office, Austria), Professor Ki-ho Yi (Director, Center for Peace and Public Integrity, Hanshin University, South Korea), and Professor Keiko Nakamura (RECNA, Nagasaki University) each reported initiatives regarding peace and disarmament education. In particular, ICU’s Professor Toshiaki Sasao introduced the research project that is currently underway, titled “Leveraging the Japan-Korea Collaborative for Peace and Disarmament Education: Evidence-based Education Program Development, Implementation, and Evaluation” (Japan Society for the Promotion of Science 2020 Grant-in-Aid for Scientific Research B), organized by ICU’s Peace Research Institute and in collaboration with Nagasaki University, Hanshin University (South Korea), and Yonsei University (South Korea). After the presentations from each of the speakers, a Q & A session was held, creating a place for the speakers and audience to engage in discussions.






